The children's restrooms are for children's use only. Should your own child need your help in the restroom, please notify a teacher (Mrs. Martinez, Ms. Jodie, Miss Jill, or Ms. Tammy) before entering the restroom to lend assistance. Adult restrooms are located through the eastern double-doors in the gym, to the left, opposite the nursery room entrance.

The faucets in the children's restrooms have been replaced, allowing the kids to be more independent and not need help as often with the faucets.

You will notice that signs are now posted that reinforce this new policy. The rules have been added and highlighted in the Parent Handbook on our website and on the bulletin board. Please contact a board member or teacher with any questions.

### Playground Project Update

As many of you have noticed, there have been some major transformations in our school yard! This may seem like a sudden change, but like many big ventures, it has taken several years, many generous donations from our families, and thousands of volunteer hours to achieve this amazing makeover.

The story all began with some mandatory changes that the state enacted upon us. We didn't have an appropriate substrate for the children to use any equipment with a height of over 18", so we had to remove anything taller than that. Our turf, gravel, and sand were not on the "approved" list, and we knew we needed to make some major changes. At that time our playground looked very barren!

Luckily we have some awesome church and Community Preschool members, along with Mrs. Martinez who really stepped up! Several hours were logged in the planning stages. From budgets to design to funding, these volunteers thought of everything. This new plan was then taken to the church for approval.

After the approval of the church, the first phase began: demolition! Many of you may have seen the pictures of sledgehammer-welding parents, volunteers, and teachers having a little too much fun breaking down the outdated cinderblock wall! New cement work was added for the shed. Some overgrown junipers were removed and the new fence line was bumped out with a streamlined new fence. All of a sudden we had an updated looking play yard! What a change already!

Next was the excavation of the ground, during a very mucky time. We had to go several inches below grade to accommodate a proper fall zone depth. Community Preschool members and students were very patient with us while we had orange fencing around our new mud pit.

After the ground dried a bit, we were able to install landscape fabric and our new appropriate mulch! New concrete curbing was installed to hold in our brand new mulch. When finances were in the right spot thanks to all the charitable donations and fundraising, we were able to populate the area with new and safe equipment! The Doodle Bug won the hearts and the votes of our students and was installed first. Next was our Shoots and Scores, donated in full by a very generous anonymous donor. Last came our awesome Bubble Climbing Wall! Our engraved bricks were installed mid-October and they look perfect!

Today the playground looks awesome and thanks to so many, phase one of our playground project is completed. During Spring 2016 we are hoping to start phase two: The Adventure Area! More details to come...
